Legal Instruments in Regulation of the Veterinary Profession







- Pursuant to Article 46:- Consumers have right to:-
- a) Goods and services of reasonable quality.
- b) The information necessary for them to gain full benefits from goods or services.
- c) The protection of their health and economic interest.

The Veterinary Surgeons and Veterinary Para-Professional Act, 2011

An act of parliament to make the training, registration and licensing of veterinary surgeons and veterinary para-professionals; to provide for matters relating to-animal health services and welfare, and for connected purposes.

- ☐ In 1963 it became veterinary surgeons Act, and then VSVP Act, 2011.

□ "The object and the purpose for which the Board is established shall be to exercise general supervision and control over the training, business, practice and employment of veterinary surgeons and paraprofessionals in Kenya and to advice the government in relation to all aspects thereof." (Section 6(1))

















Veterinary practices Continued...






